FOREWORD

N presenting for dispersal by public sale the last important group of works belonging to the famous John Quinn Collection, which is generally conceded to be an outstanding collection of modern and ultra-modern art both in America and Europe, the American Art Association is well aware of the little need of a detailed introduction of its founder to their art patrons. The late John Quinn was one of the foremost bank lawyers of the past decade, combining with his brilliant professional gifts a discriminating aesthetic sense of extraordinary power. He was probably the most courageous patron of the arts of his time—this in the literal sense of the phrase, since to patronize anything but the living is not to be a patron but a collector. Mr. Quinn had gathered modern sculpture and paintings on a scale unprecedented and with a taste for those provided with the substance of genius. A whole chapter might be devoted to his personal relationships with the artists from whom he purchased so many of these works, some of whom have been regarded as somewhat revolutionary by the academicians, but unquestionably they are the artists who represent the times.

The exhibition will afford a glimpse of one of the most admirable selections of modern painting and sculpture, and a rare opportunity for the collector who cares to enjoy the art of today; an art, furthermore, that is a reaction from cold, affected classicism and false idealism.

A summary of the American artists is as follows: Arthur B. Davies, Maurice B. Prendergast, Ernest Lawson, Walt Kuhn, George Hart, Charles Sheeler, Morton L. Schamberg, Marsden Hartley, S. Macdonald Wright, Max Weber, and the sculptor, Jacob Epstein. The French are represented by Henri Martisse, André Derain, Paul Gauguin, Puvis de Chavannes, Maurice de Vlaminck, Robert Delaunay, Jacques Villon, Alexandre Blanchet, Albert Gleizes, Jean Metzinger, Gino Severini, Lucien Pissarro, Auguste Chabaud, Paul Lafitte, and two sculptors, the late Raymond Duchamp-Villon and Henri Gaudier-Brzeska. The British by Augustus John and his sister, Gwen John, Charles Conder, Charles H. Shannon, Wyndham Lewis, Edward Wadsworth, J. D. Innes, Derwent Lees, C. R. W. Nevinson, John S. Currie, Spencer F. Gore, David Bomberg and Geoffrey Nelson. Four distinctly Irish painters are represented: George W. Russell ("A. E."), the late Nathaniel Hone, the late John Butler Yeats, and Jack B. Yeats, the younger son of John Butler Yeats. All are represented at their best and in their various phases, from luminaristic impressionism to post-impressionism, cubism and vorticism. If, on viewing this collection and upon a survey of the progress of civilization with its reflection to art, we can still admire the amazing realism of the Van Dycks, the intellect and power of Michelangelo, the greatness of Rembrandt, the mysticism of Corot, and the vital attempts of the moderns and ultra-moderns to portray human emotions, either abstract or concrete, of the vortiginous close to the nineteenth century, we may be said to have achieved an ideal understanding of art.

It is the suggestiveness to spirit and imagination that is the keynote of this collection. Matter is impermanent; the forms in which it appears to the eye are temporary. These present masters have striven to get away as far as possible from the accidents of impermanent form. In their attempts to do so they have simplified, generalized and conventionalized matter. Briefly, their longing is for the ultimate, the universal. While the classicists and academicians strive to give perfection of form so that, through a series of means, they may express an ideal of physical perfection, the modern reaches his ideal through the abstract with a perfection of beautiful lines, patterns and colors.
